### MISSIONS, OUTREACH, AND FELLOWSHIP

**Beginning in January,** we will have a new committee working on 'outreach' in our community. Some of the ideas that have been brought forward are: serving a lunch once a month for our neighbors and serving a breakfast once a week for students at Laguna High School (El Molino campus). We welcome any other new ideas to serve our community – put on your thinking cap and offer fellowship ideas and your volunteer service to the Mission and Outreach Team!

We're also discussing starting up **Soul Café** again. For those who are not familiar with Soul Café; it is a soup supper prepared by a local non-profit, and music in the Sanctuary by local musicians. A collection is taken for the musicians; the supper (soup, salad, and bread) is \$10 of which our church gets 10 percent and the non-profit gets 90 percent.

It is held on a Sunday evening from 5:00 - 6:30pm every other month. It does need quite a few volunteers for set up and take down and collecting and counting the money, etc. We had a very good turn out from the community when we were having Soul Café (pre pandemic).

**The Just Off-Center Thrift Store** opened on November 5, 2022. In the first year the Thrift Store raised over \$5000 for church programs. Now in our second year the Thrift Store has committed a minimum donation of \$250 per month as a "fundraiser". We urge you to stop by when we're open to see what good deals are available to you!

The Thrift Store is open from **10am-2pm** on the first Saturday of every month. We are open on a few other special days – watch the sign in the church parking lot. We need more volunteers to staff the store and handle sorting and displaying items. Contact Joan Mortensson or Vickie Holden to offer your services.

**Hey MEN!** It's been a while since the **United Methodist Men** gathered on a Saturday morning for breakfast, meditation and work projects. But the need to offer opportunities for service and spiritual fellowship is an idea now being discussed. Contact Neil Yeager or Mike Mortensson to discuss how you could participate.

**VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES**: Many people now offer their time and service to the programs of FUMC but we need more volunteers to continue and expand God's love to others.
